The Campbell Plant Should Be The Main Place Now Where the Conservative Republicans of Ottawa County Draw the Line Against the Globalist Agenda

Furthermore, the Campbell plant is a strong position on which for us to fight. First, we have the legal means in a home rule charter county to municipalize that plant and turn it over to a county electric cooperative, and legal means to delay its demolition before that. Michigan constitutional law is clear on this issue. And then Whitmer, Nessel, the Sierra Club, etc. have to negotiate with Ottawa County and the county electric cooperative over when that plant closes. It will be out of the hands of Consumers Energy, and Consumers Energy will have been paid for it. Second, this is an area where all citizens in Ottawa County, and even many citizens outside of Ottawa County, plus parties like Wolverine Power, have a common interest in seeing that plant survive past 2025. We all have a common practical interest in reliable, affordable, environmental electric. Finally, it is the moral thing to do.

Nevertheless, with all of the above said, this "Save The Campbell" effort will stand or fall depending upon whether God should choose to bless it: "The horse is prepared against the day of battle: but safety is of the LORD." We should have a county charter consistent with the USA's founding Christian constitutional principles. We can hardly ask for God's favor if we are unwilling to have a charter pleasing to God. It is possible to have a legal charter pleasing to God, and so that is what we should pray for and seek.
